

Pupil Premium Funding Statement 2015-16

Pupil Premium funding was introduced by the government in April 2011 and is additional funding given to schools so that they can support their Pupil Premium eligible students and close the attainment gap between them and their peers. Students who are eligible for the

Pupil Premium funding include students who:

- Are entitled to or are in receipt of free school meals, or have been in the last six years
- Are children of service personnel, or have been in the last four years
- Are in care or have ever been in care
- Have been adopted from care
- Have left care under a residential order or a special guardianship order

Schools received £935 per eligible student in 2015/16, and so received £133 700
